
The South of France in the age of the Impressionists



6 – 19 June 2013

A 14-day tour following in the footsteps of the painters who sought inspiration in the dazzling light and vibrant colours of the south of France.



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The South of France in the Age of the Impressionists

In the 1870's the Impressionists gathered in the cafés and cabarets of Montmartre to plan their exhibitions, but by the last decades of the 19th century they had disbanded and were searching for new directions for their art. Their fascination with light and pure colour brought them south, away from the grey light of Paris to what were then the simple villages of Provence and the Côte d'Azur.

Travels Through Time will take a small group of around 15 people on this 14 day tour to evoke the sights, sounds and smells of the vivid landscapes of the south of France, and will follow in the footsteps of the painters who sought inspiration in its dazzling light and vibrant colours. Using Nice, Aix—en—Provence and Toulouse as our bases, we will explore the landscapes and little villages immortalized by Renoir, Monet, Cézanne, Dufy, Van Gogh, Matisse, Leger, Chagall, Cocteau and Toulouse Lautrec.

Around Nice we will visit small perched villages such as Biot, St Paul and Vence as well as luminous coastal towns such as Cap Ferrat, Villefranche, Cagnes sur Mer and Antibes where Picasso, Renoir, Matisse and Fernand Leger

painted. Moving to our second base in Aix en Provence among the lavender, sunflowers and cicadas, we will follow in Cézanne's footsteps and retrace Van Gogh's turbulent séjour in Arles, St Rémy and Saintes Maries de la Mer in the Camargue. After visiting the spectacular landscapes of the Baux, we will travel to our last base, Toulouse, from where we will discover its wonderful museums and the spectacular sights of Albi, Cordes sur Ciel, Carcassonne and the surrounding countryside sprinkled with ruined chateaux of the Cathars.


The tour will be led by Sylvia Sagona, specialist in 19th century French art and literature, who has been taking lecture tours to France for the past twelve years.
